During the **100 Days Intensive Awareness Campaign** against child marriage, awareness activities were conducted in schools, colleges, religious institutions, Panchayats and communities to promote child rights and prevent child marriage. Awareness Chariots were also flagged off by Minister Hafizul Hasan, DC, Deoghar and District & Block level officials. The campaign also engaged stakeholders & community to strengthen collective action and community responsibility towards building a Child Marriage Free India by 2030.

EMPOWERING THE ADOLESCENTS & YOUTHS

- ➔ Structured refresher sessions were conducted for 35 adolescent groups, while capacity-building interventions strengthened the leadership, facilitation and problem-solving skills of 65 groups.
- ➔ Training on PRI systems, local governance and advocacy enhanced the confidence and leadership abilities of 312 peer leaders.
- ➔ Fifty joint parent-adolescent meetings and regular home visits improved school attendance, family communication and participation of vulnerable adolescents in group activities.
- ➔ Community awareness programs on child rights, education, prevention of child marriage, gender equality and access to government schemes were conducted at village level.
- ➔ Fifty school drop-out adolescents were linked with vocational and skill development programs to improve livelihood opportunities.
- ➔ Youth groups implemented 22 social action projects, including sanitation drives, awareness campaigns, school enrolment initiatives and applications for basic services and infrastructure.
- ➔ Exposure visits and interactions with Panchayati Raj Institutions and block officials strengthened youth understanding of governance systems and civic participation.
- ➔ Ten adolescent groups submitted demands to Mukhiya and BDO offices, of which four groups successfully accessed services based on their demands.
- ➔ A two-day concluding workshop with 25 youth leaders provided a platform for reflection, learning, and future planning, reinforcing youth-led social change and child protection initiatives.

Continuous handholding and technical support were provided to all JIVA farmers to strengthen climate-resilient natural farming practices.

The JIVA one-acre demonstration model attracted several visitors and farmers who visited the site to learn and understand the complete process of natural farming and sustainable agricultural practices.

SALIENT MILESTONES

Towards Child Protection

- Focus group discussions (FGDs) were conducted with Natural Leaders and PRI members to strengthen awareness on child protection and safety.
- Workshops on puppet-making and storytelling enabled girls to spread awareness on social issues through village performances.
- Families were supported in accessing sponsorship programs and government welfare schemes through guidance on documentation and follow-up.
- Community-managed initiatives like Poshan Vatika and health camps improved children's nutrition and health outcomes.
- Regular sensitization and awareness of religious leaders, PRIs, Adolescents and community were organized.
- Participation of adolescents in block level workshops on child marriage and social evils.
- Special career Counselling program was held in KGBV, Deogarh
- Special focused session on PCMA, POCSO Act, Child Rights, Child Trafficking, etc was held on International Girl Child Day.
- Shishu-Kishor Mela was organized on the occasion of Children's Day in Topchanchi block, Dhanbad.

HEALTH, SANITATION & NUTRITION



With the support of SBIF, primary healthcare services were provided under the Sanjivni Clinic on Wheels Project.

- A total of 990 OPDs consultations were conducted.
- 57 awareness camps were organized to promote health awareness and preventive care.
- 7 special health camps were conducted to provide focused healthcare services to the community.
- 9 Swachh Bharat Abhiyan initiatives were carried out to promote cleanliness and hygiene awareness.
